



Seven pioneering families of the district financed electrical and painting works to the museum and hence the rooms are now known as the Brill, Cox, Hamblin, Hatty, Logan, McPherson and Quinn Rooms. The McKay Room was later added in honour of HV McKay, creator of the famous Sunshine brand, who was an early settler of the Matong district.

.....A short history

The land where the Ganmain & District Historical Society now is was first purchased in 1902 by James Lynam, who history names 'the builder of Ganmain'. In 1912, the Warran family commenced a long and significant association with the site, when John Warran bought the land and built his home and business premises there. It remained the property of the Warran family until 1973 when the trustees of the Historical Society bought it from John's grandson. The connection lives on with Peter Warran being an active member of the Society, today.

The premises officially opened as a museum in March 1985 with over 400 items of interest being catalogued and on display. The collection has grown significantly with farming implements, household items, sporting and war memorabilia and a large archive of photographs and newspaper items now housed at the museum.

.....Origins

The Origins of the Ganmain Historical Society date back to 1973 when, at a local clearing sale, six district people combined resources to buy an old harvester. They did this in recognition that heritage agricultural equipment and other objects were being lost to the local community and something needed to done.
